The former concerns the social effects of this uncontrollability, and the possible legal instruments to protect the community. The latter regards the exploitation for economic purposes of this characteristic and the social and legal changes deriving from it, such as, for instance, IoT, the diffused and pervasive data collection on people, profiling, Privacy by design, etc.

SPECIAL ISSUE: The use of the Internet and the socio-economic changes in the glocalized society, the person the finance and the market in 'cyberspace'

If the global connection potentially opens up the universe of the market and finance to the whole world, at the same time the territorial location of the place of exchange or production loses its importance, instead the latter is acquired by the relevant legal order. Local production, taking advantage of a global market, can take full advantage of the territory's skills and exclusivity. A similar argument can apply to the direction of financial intermediation, which traditionally starts from a disadvantaged territory and heads towards a few territories considered favorable for investment. The global connection, expanding the market, allows an opposite direction, which brings funds and investments locally, to disadvantaged territories. Even more so where the dematerialization of work and business allows a territorial location of the workers themselves, think of teleworking, for example. Equally, in the online financial market, the new bargaining possibilities allow for glocalised finance. Glocal Exchanges and online stock markets, currency and glocal electronic coins, are already technically possible and economically advantageous. The centralization, required by law in Italy, of the financial market now appears to be a penalizing burden of the past. Instead, the choice of legal rules that make this field fully competitive and open becomes strategic, so as to be able to take full advantage of the potential of glocalised finance.


